

## **Suggested Items to Bring:**

- Closed-toe/closed-heel SHOES (no Crocs) are a requirement for Space Camp simulations
  - If you would like to wear sandals, please bring close-toe/ closed-heel shoes with you to the Rocket Center campus.
- Casual clothes for outdoor activities
- Sweatshirt or other layers for indoor activities (The AC can be chilly.)
- Clothes hangers, alarm clock if desired
- Money for miscellaneous (i.e. taxi fare, or vending machines. No stores within walking distance.)
- Sunscreen and hat
- Snacks/coffee machine
- Cell phone and charger
- Bug spray
- Toiletry items (deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, hair dryer, medications, etc.)
- Umbrella and rain gear
- Swimwear (see description below) \*
- Towels for the dorm
- Beach/swim towel separate from dorm towels.
- While some teachers bring their laptop to use in the evenings in the dorms, personal laptops are not needed for any of the activities.
- \* For the Aviation Challenge Water Activities, you will be hanging from a parachute harness and you will want the extra fabric of long shorts and a T-shirt. (Separate from the one you



are wearing for the rest of day's activities as they will get wet.) Even if you are not a swimmer, please bring swimming clothes. You can choose not to participate; however, this is the only place in the world where this type of simulation is available. You may also prefer to bring a pool towel for this activity.

- Females one-piece, conservative suit, with a pair of water-proof shorts, t-shirt, and a beach towel.
- Males long trunks/short-like suit (not Speedo-type), t-shirt, and a beach towel.
